



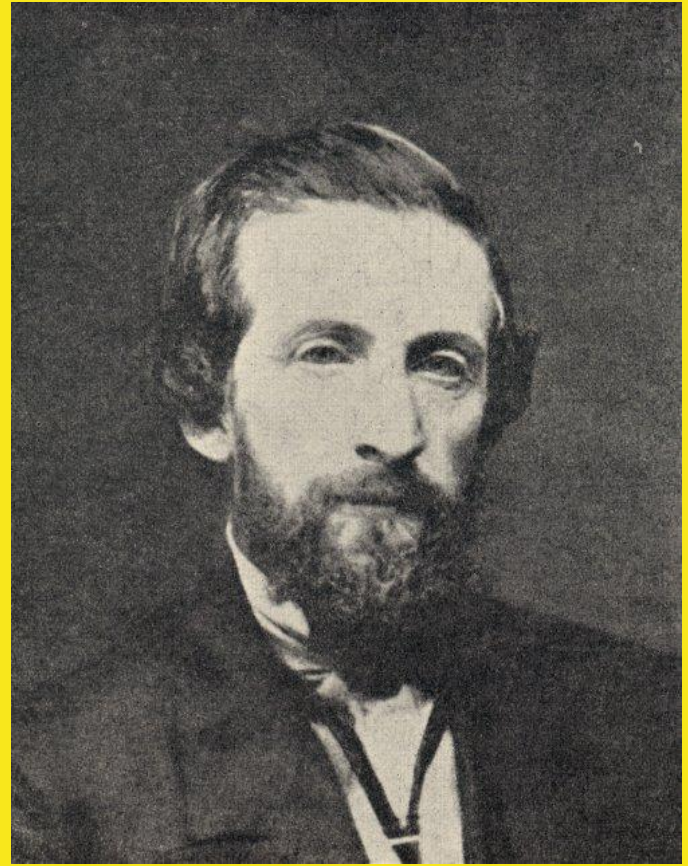

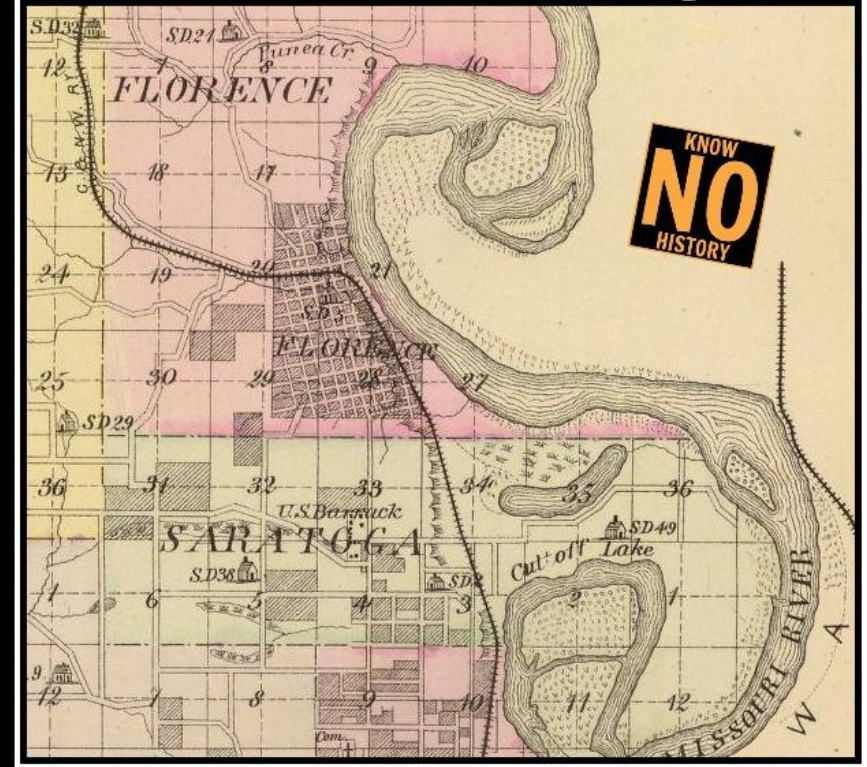

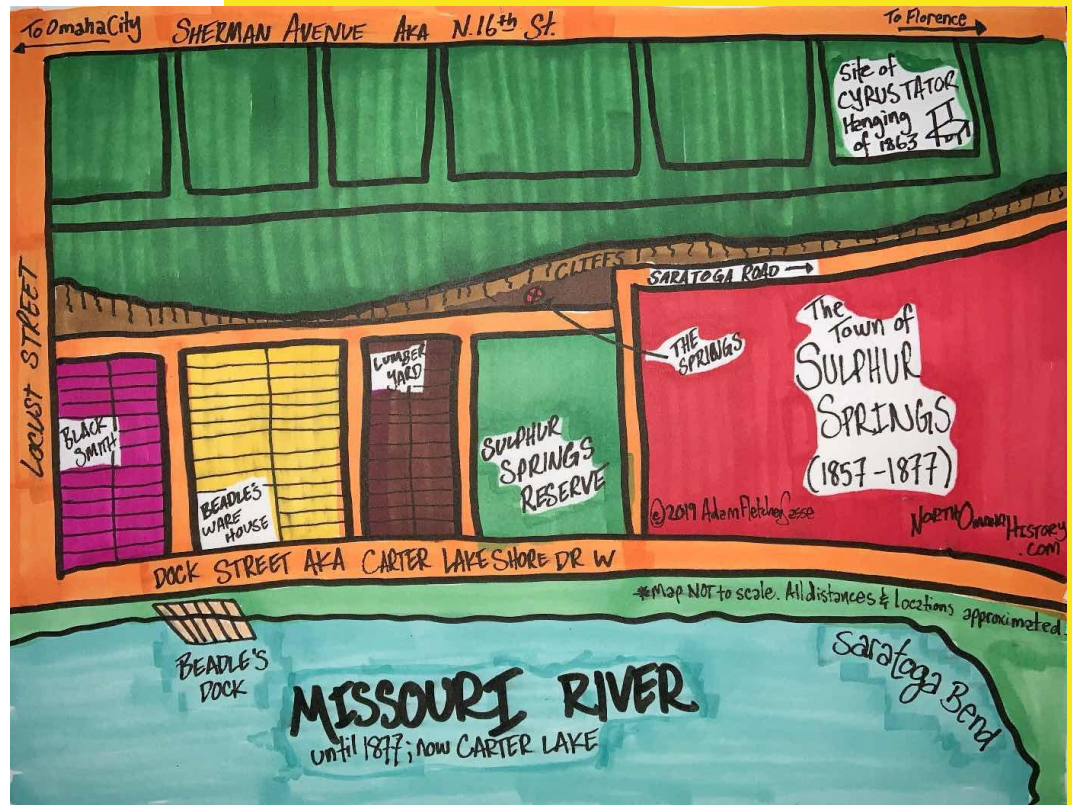
Saratoga Township (1866)

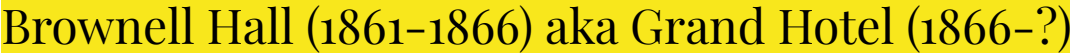
The Towns of Florence and Saratoga (1884)

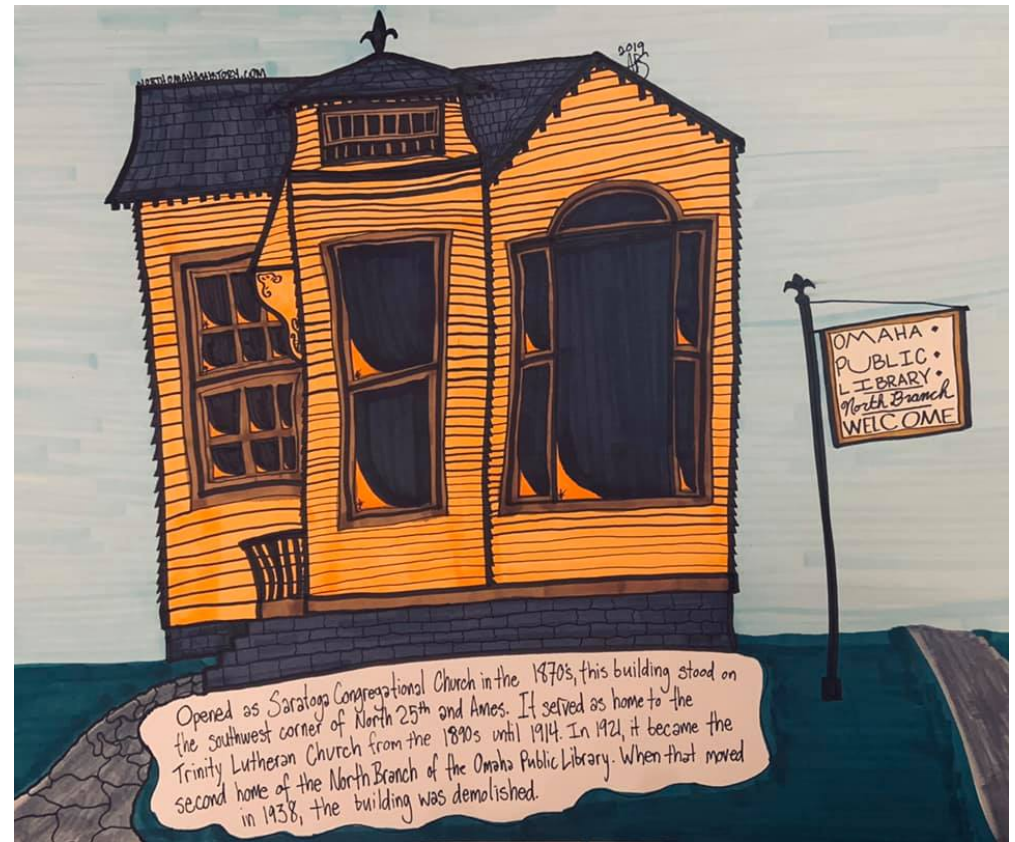




Sulphur Springs (1857)







Opened as Saratoga Congregational Church in the 1870s, this building stood on the southwest corner of North 25th and Ames. It served as home to the Trinity Lutheran Church from the 1890s until 1914. In 1921, it became the second home of the North Branch of the Omaha Public Library. When that moved in 1938, the building was demolished.

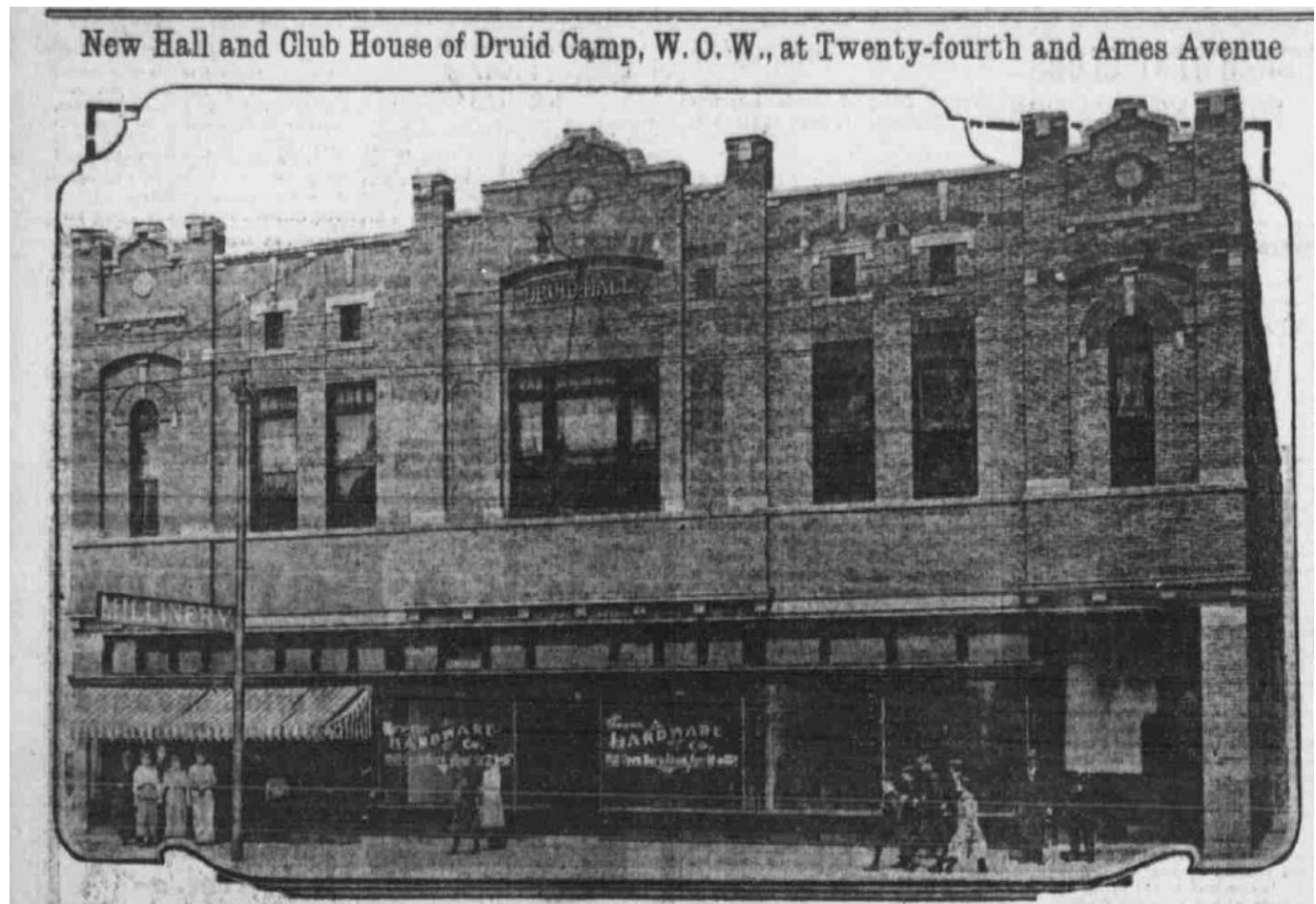

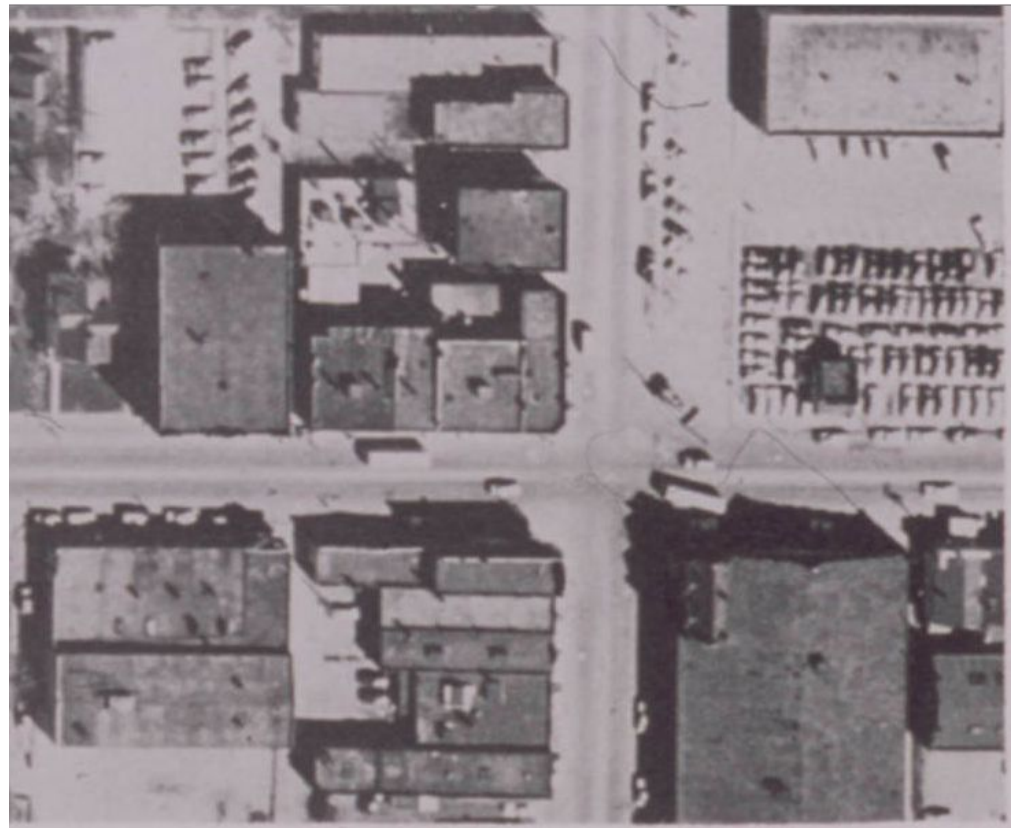

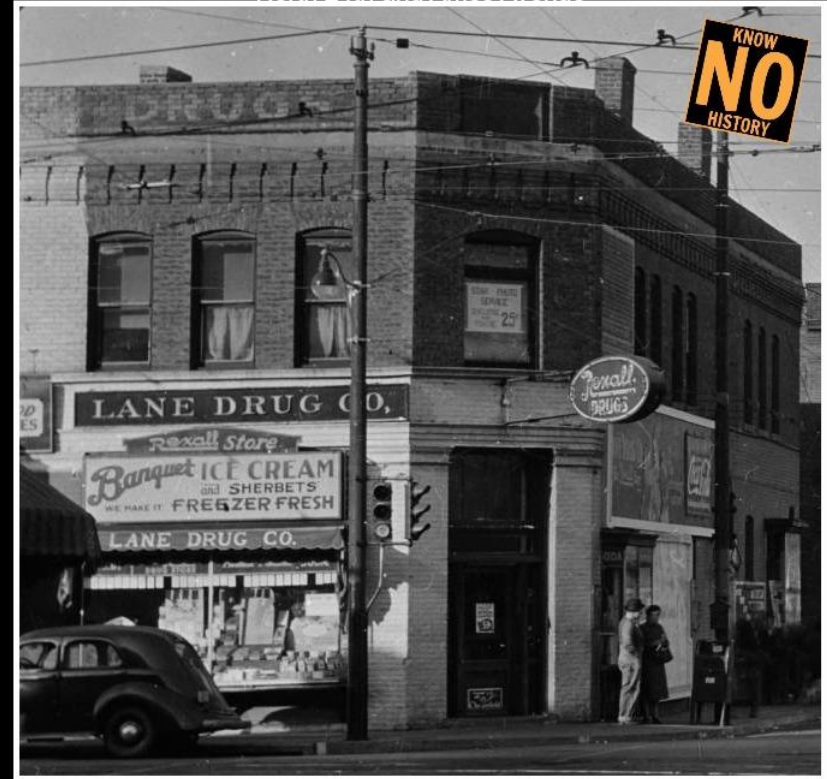

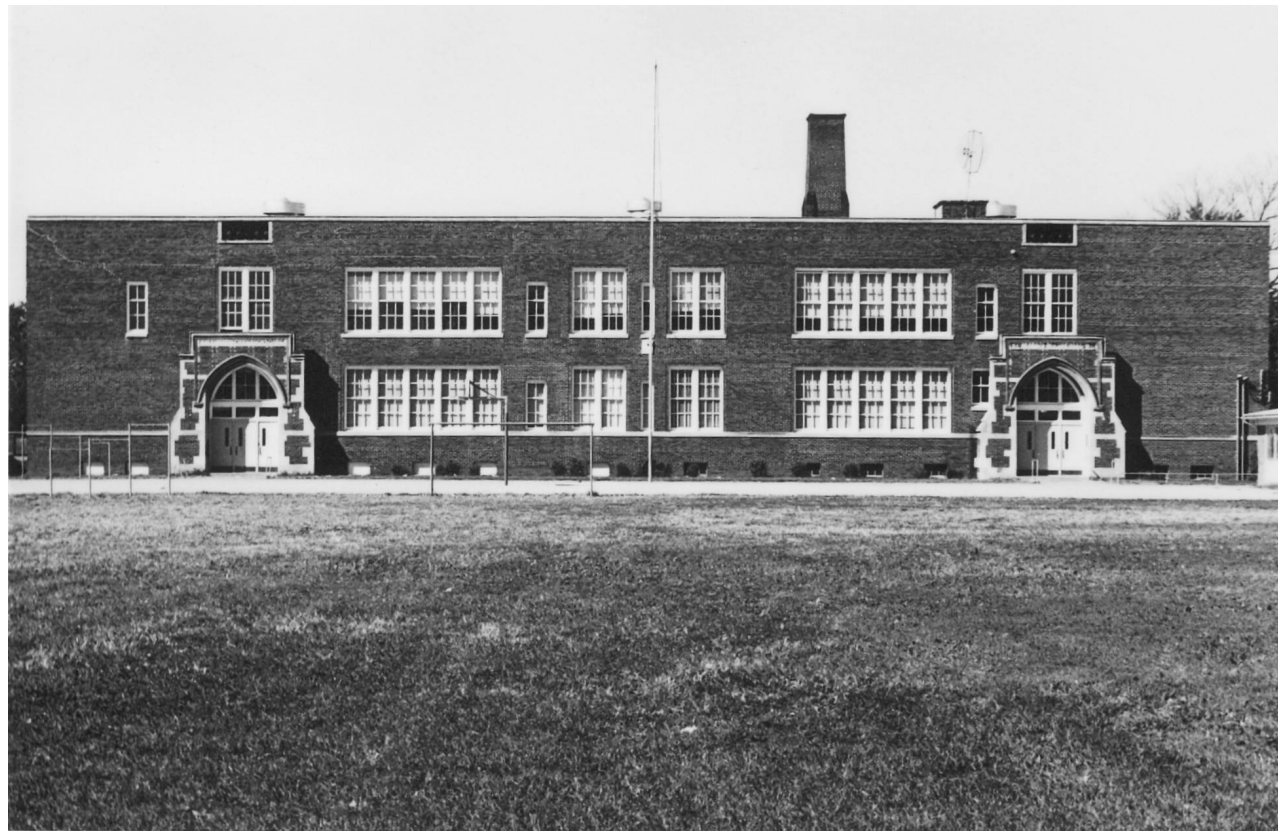

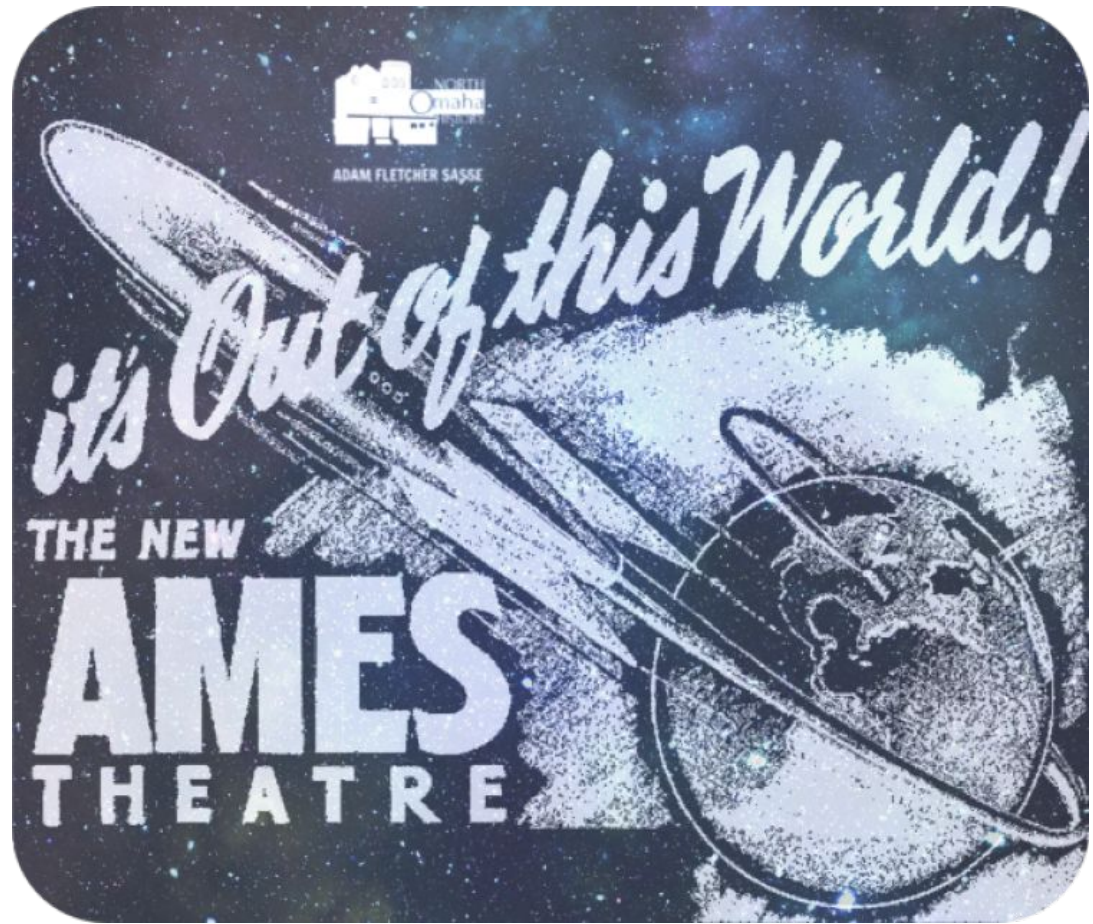
